



COMMISSION RESOLUTION NO. 2022-002 ADOPTING THE NPTE PERFORMANCE EVALUATION PROCESS

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 10 of Republic Act (RA) No. 9729 or the Climate Change Act of 2009, as amended, the Climate Change Commission (CCC) constituted its National Panel of Technical Experts (NPTE) consisting of reputed Filipino experts in climate science, climate change adaptation and mitigation, and other disciplines related to climate change, including disaster risk reduction;

WHEREAS, the NPTE provides technical advice to the CCC in climate science, green technologies, risk assessment, strengthening the adaptive capacity of climate and disaster vulnerable communities, and in the project appraisal, monitoring and evaluation process for climate financing;

WHEREAS, the Commission shall set the qualifications and compensation for the NPTE as provided by Section 10 of RA No. 9729;

WHEREAS, Rule VII of the Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations of RA 9729, as amended, provides that the Commission, upon consultation with the Department of Budget and Management (DBM), may set the honoraria for the members of the NPTE either on a per-meeting or on a per-month basis, or other arrangements as deemed appropriate;

WHEREAS, pertinent DBM issuances have been the bases for determining the proposed honoraria rates, along with performance standards for the services to be rendered by the NPTE based on the Terms of Reference (TOR) adopted by the Commission under Resolution No. 2021-004;

WHEREAS, the Roles and Responsibilities of the NPTE in accordance with RA 9729 and outlined in Section II of the TOR of the NPTE are to provide assistance to CCC and various government agencies and attendance and participation in official meetings and activities, as adopted in Commission Resolution 2021-004;

WHEREAS, the members of the NPTE are also expected to prepare and submit output related to climate change-related activities requested by CCC and Climate Change Office (CCO), as outlined in Section III of the NPTE TOR, as adopted in Commission Resolution 2021-004;

WHEREAS, there is a need to establish the Performance Evaluation indicators and workflow for processing of the NPTE honorarium for the purpose of serving as the basis of quarterly honoraria processing and payment of the members of the NPTE;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commission shall institutionalize the Performance Evaluation Form (attached as Annex A) and NPTE honorarium workflow (attached as Annex B);

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Commission through the NPTE Secretariat, shall evaluate the performance of the Panel members using the following, but not limited to, indicators as outlined in the Performance Evaluation Form:

1. Attendance and/or participation in the quarterly regular NPTE meetings and planning workshops/ discussions/ meetings led by CCC;

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 Participation and/or organization of climate change-related meetings, forums, and activities upon request of National Government Agencies, Local Government Units, State Universities and Colleges, Higher Education Institutions, among others;

 Provision of expert comments and inputs to official climate change-related reports, agreements, policies, programs, projects and technical support and assistance, and other climate change-related documents upon request; and

4. Participation in and/or provision/contribution of advice and inputs in IPCC and other international climate change and disaster risk forums

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the rate of honoraria (Annex C), in consideration of pertinent provisions of Section VII of R-IRR, as well as DBM Circular 2007-001 and 2007-002 and the agreement made for determining the NPTE honoraria during the Year 2022 Budget Briefing on 11-12 May 2022, shall be based on quantifiable outputs based on the Terms of Reference of the NPTE per Commission Resolution No. 2021-004, and shall be subject to monitoring of accomplishments of the NPTE with respect to climate change-related activities, consolidation of supporting documents, evaluation and certification of the Performance Evaluation Form, transmittal of the Performance Evaluation Form and supporting documents to the release of honorarium of NPTE members shall comprise the NPTE honorarium workflow, conducted on a quarterly basis;

RESOLVED FURTHER, hat the effectiveness of this Performance Evaluation Process shall encompass the evaluation of the NPTE performance beginning the adoption of Commission Resolution No. 2021-009¹ on 13 October 2021, and shall be periodically reviewed in the exigency of public service.

RESOLVED FINALLY, that the Commission adopts the Performance Evaluation form (attached as Annex A) as guideline for processing of the NPTE honoraria and its corresponding attachments to be issued as a Special Order, consistent with aforecited laws and Commission Resolutions, as well as pertinent budgetary, accounting, and auditing rules and regulations.
